KITCHEN TRENDS

Light, bright and airy! Most kitchens you'll find will be mostly white, with light wood floors and coordinating wood accents whether that be a hutch, the island, or maybe a pop of wood on the hood or some open shelves. You'll often find a mix of finishes, with bronze or black cabinet hardware and either black or brass light fixtures. To continue with the clean lines of the modern farmhouse style, you'll find quartz as the material of choice for the countertops. You'll want to keep it simple with the backsplash – a classic white subway tile, or mix it up with a white handmade backsplash to add some texture and character.





BATHROOMS

Very much in keeping with the kitchen, you'll want to keep the bathrooms light and airy! A punch of color here and there is okay, but for the most part you'll still want whites, creams, soft grays and wood tones. Black and brass accents are still okay, and even chrome or polished nickel for the plumbing! For an owner's bath, a freestanding tub and a furniture style vanity are key to make the space feel extra special.

LIGHTING

In keeping with everything else modern farmhouse, you'll want to keep your light fixtures relatively simple and clean – nothing frilly or fussy! Bronze, black, gold and nickel tones are acceptable - and welcomed!
